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Background

UCC Library launched its Library Learning Resources course on Canvas at the start of the 2020 academic year. The course consists of seven, self-directed interdisciplinary modules on information searching & Library resources.

In May 2021, the Library received funding from the National Forum for the Enhancement of Teaching and Learning in Higher Education via the University's Centre for the Integration of Research, Teaching and Learning to improve the Library's Canvas course and co-create interactive learning experiences.

- more opportunities to test learning

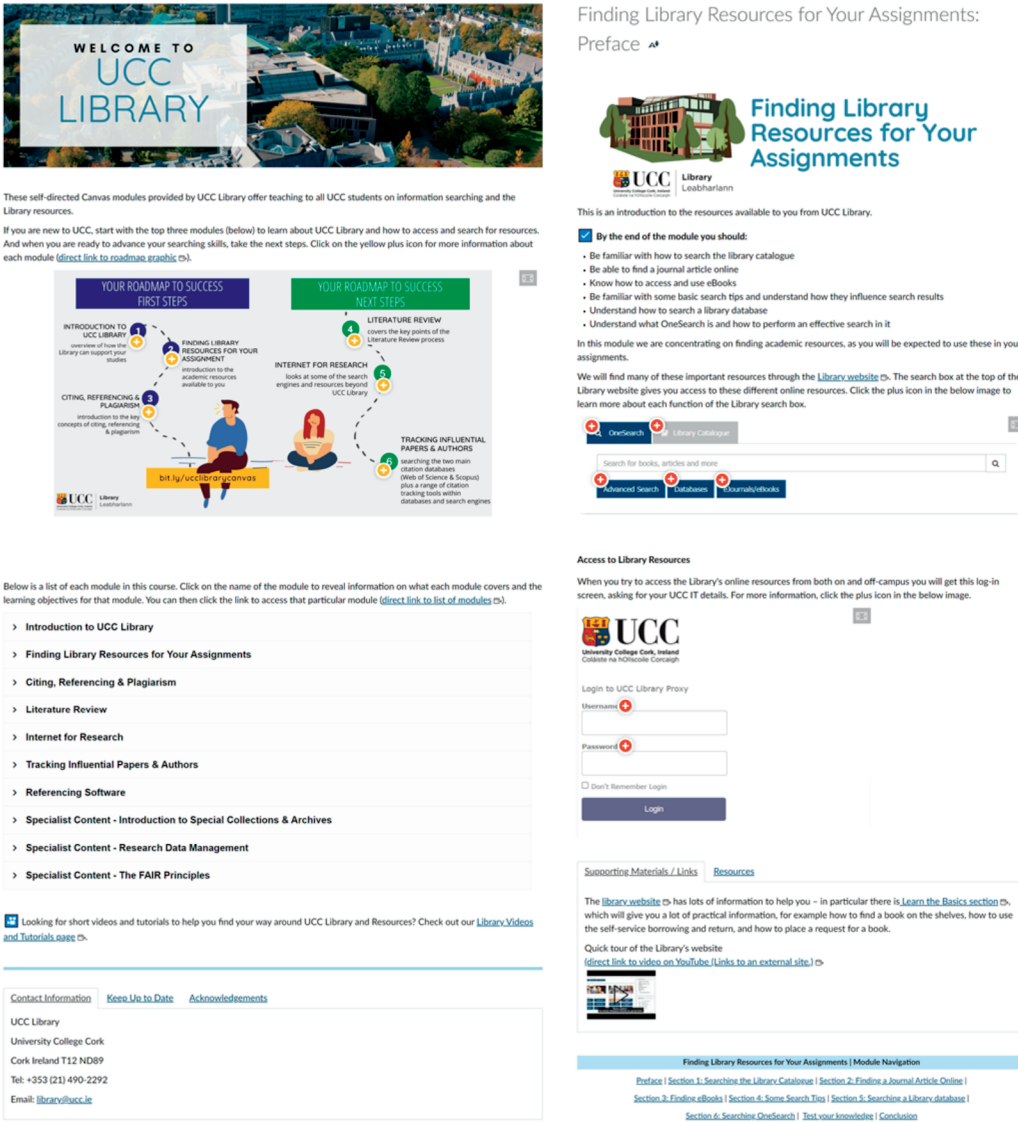
Overall Thoughts

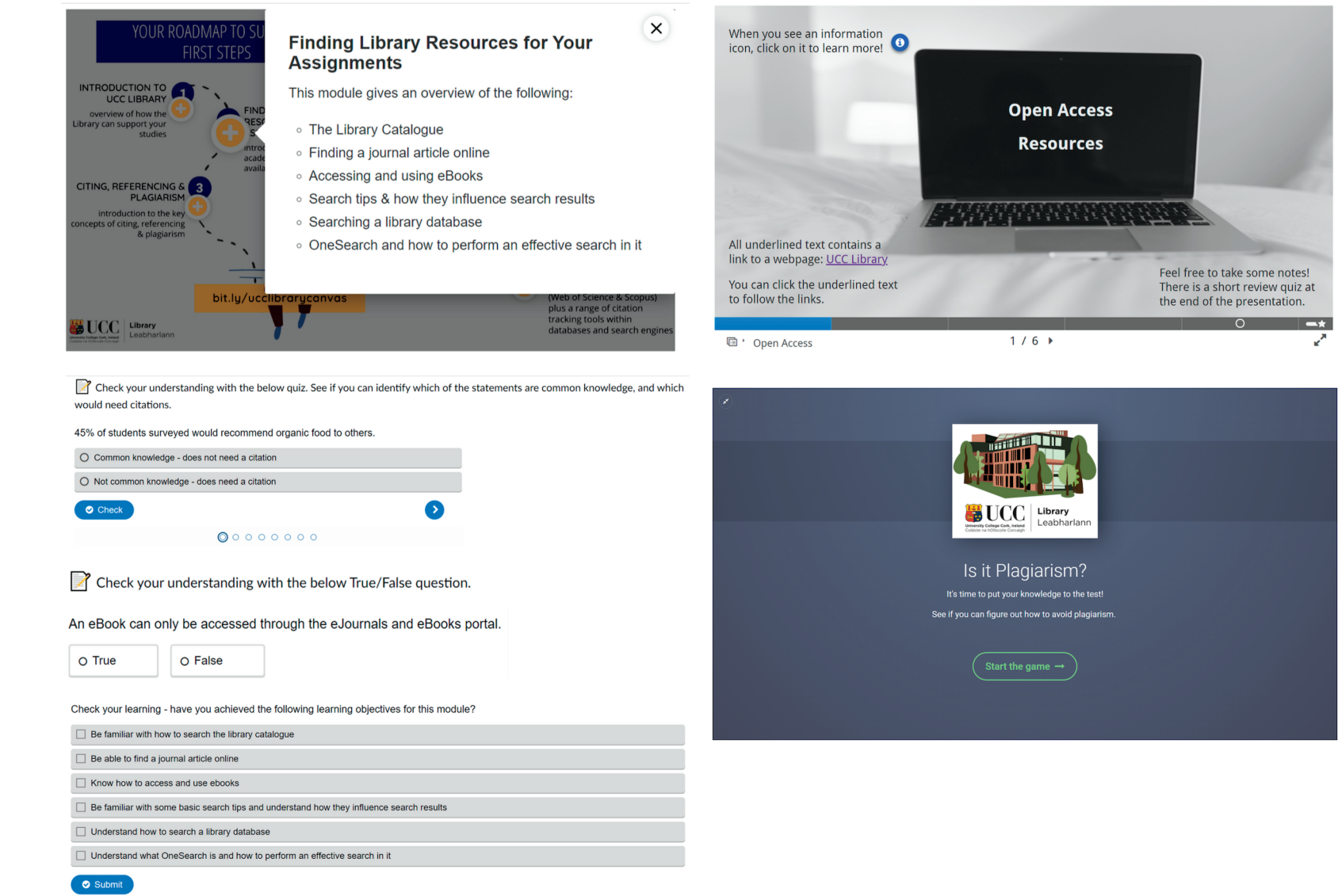

- Feedback positive but very few plays

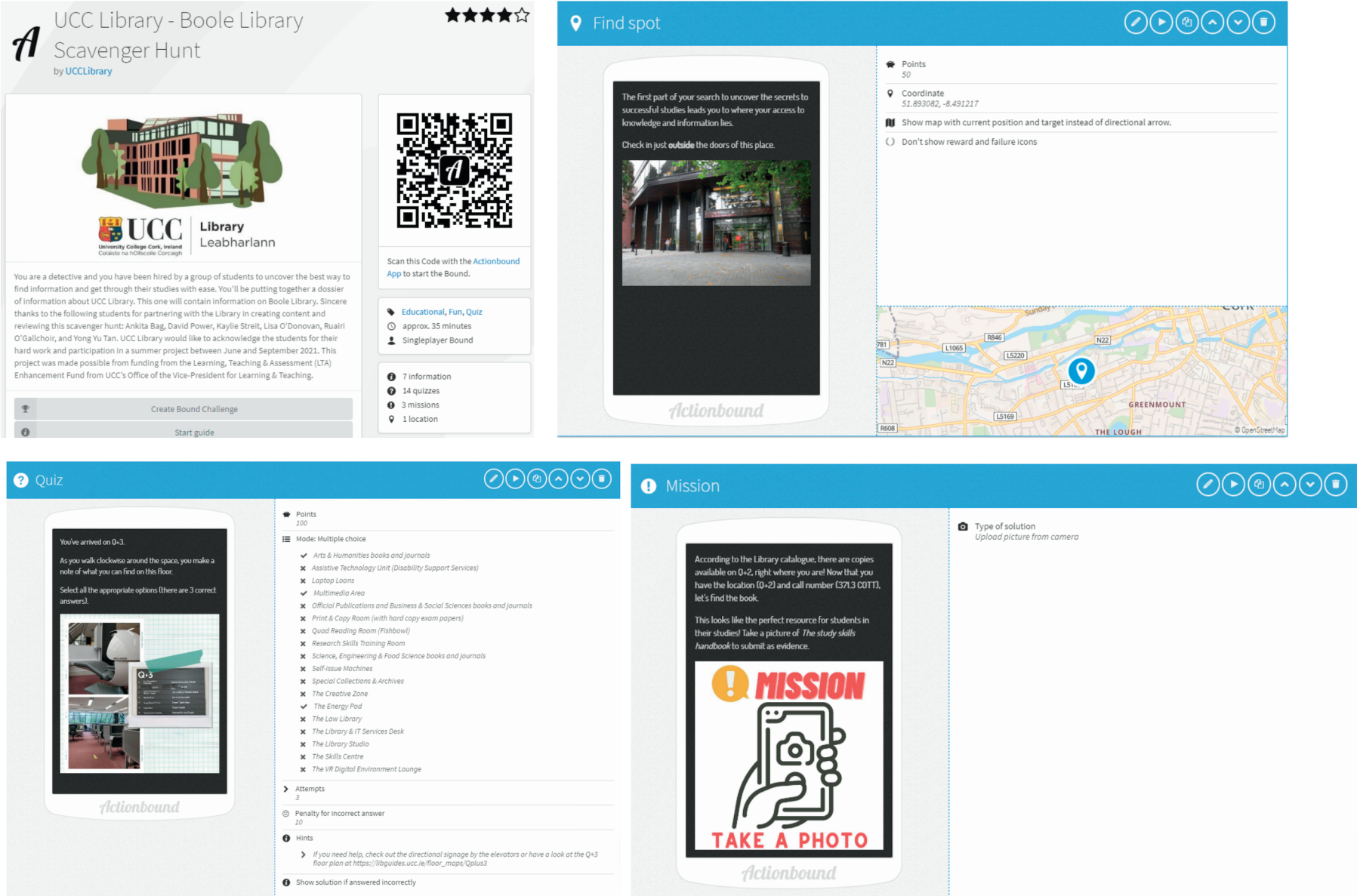
LibWizard

- Concerns about student access to LibWizard

- Makes course and modules more interactive
- Using technology to enhance and support learning
