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



UCC Library launched its Library Learning Resources course on Canvas at the start of the 2020 academic year.


Initial course was developed by Claire O'Brien and Catherine Clehane (Library Learning & Teaching Team).

Canvas Modules

Course consists of seven, self-directed interdisciplinary modules.

Offer teaching to all UCC students on information searching and Library resources.

Also includes specialist content from Special Collections & Archives and Research Services.





If students had questions or needed help, could consult with their Library staff partner.


H₅P

H5P is an abbreviation for HTML5 Package, and aims to make it easy for everyone to create, share and reuse interactive HTML5 content

 - ➤ The numbers (300.72 GRAY, 371.3 CURR, 300.72 ODOC, 371.3 BELL) are call numbers for books. These numbers can be found on the spine of a book. Can you find the first book, either on the shelf or using the Library catalogue - 300.72 GRAY? What is the title of this book? Once you figure out the title, how do you think the number 4 relates to the code?
 - The title of the first book (300.72 GRAY) is "Doing research in the real world." The 4th word in the title is THE. That must be the first word in the code! Now see if you can figure out the other words in the code by following the same steps (finding the book based on the call number on the shelf or using the Library catalogue, checking the title, and seeing what word you need from the title).
 - 371.3 CURR is the call number for the book "Developing and applying study skills: writing assignments, dissertations and management reports." What is the 4th word in this title? This is the 2nd word in the code. See if you can figure out the rest of the code.
 - 300.72 ODOC is the call number for the book "Internet research skills: how to do your literature search and find research information online." What is the 3rd word in this title? This is the 3rd word in the code. See if you can figure out the rest of the code.
 - 371.3 BELL is the call number for the book "Active learning handbook: for the multiple intelligences classroom." What is the 3rd word in this title? This is the final word in the code. Put all the words together - what do you get?
